Your School Lottery is a purpose-led digital fundraising platform that was created for parents, by parents, to offer an easy and fun alternative to the more traditional fundraising sources. Pioneered and managed by Gatherwell Ltd, an award-winning lottery provider, Your School Lottery was the first-of-its-kind ethical lottery platform for parents, carers and the school community, created and dedicated for the purpose of advancing the educational needs of all children in the UK.

Since its launch over a decade ago, Your School Lottery has been a reliable and popular digital fundraising source, helping PTAs and teachers at participating schools across Britain, reach their funding goals. With over £10.5 million raised since 2014, running a school lottery with Your School Lottery can make a huge impact and helps schools improve the quality of education for all students in an easy and fun way!

With the growing pressure on schools and PTAs to up their fundraising game, we love hearing how parents are embracing the transformative power of a lottery and supporting their schools.

Teachers and parents raise their concerns on a national scale

A snapshot survey by the National Education Union¹ of 3,981 teacher members working in English state schools, carried out online in October 2023, revealed grievous concerns about funding.

What teachers say:



School funding levels do not allow for enough learning resources.



believe that current funding levels are not high enough to allow their school to employ enough teachers, or for other staff to support pupils' learning.



of teachers and leaders say that investment in school buildings has been insufficient. Just 15% have seen enough investment in upkeep of their buildings.



to provide appropriate learning resources for pupils because of current funding levels.

What parents say:

We need to see a major shift and significant investment in schools. Our children deserve better.



of parents struggle to keep up with the costs of school uniforms.



say they don't have disposable income to pay for school trips and feel that the school should fund these.



of parents can't afford to pay for technology such as computers, tablets or internet access.

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When schools are underfunded, children suffer

As we've been actively involved in school fundraising for over a decade, we understand the collective pressure on schools and parents to help source additional funds to improve the school environment and enrich the pupils' education. These pressures impact the entire community, as underfunded schools lead to unstable learning environments, less qualified teachers and poor support services.

Every year, the question of school funding in the UK is becoming more and more of a concern. The Institute for Fiscal Studies (IFS) says costs will outpace funding for schools in 2025-26.

The schools leaders' union NAHT reports that: there has been a period of 15 years with no overall growth in school spending and that Schools are now facing new and significant cost pressures e.g. surging energy prices, covid-related costs, falling primary pupil numbers, the National Insurance increase, and pressures due to significant underfunding of SEND.

The most significant impact on cost during this period, which most schools had insufficient fiscal headroom to manage and offset, and some schools are still recovering from, was Covid-19-related spending.

In a report by the **Nuffield Foundation** in collaboration with ASK Research on the cost-of-living-crisis: impact on schools, the report highlights "how cost-of-living pressures have increased both the number of pupils requiring additional support and the level of need among these pupils, including well-being and mental health needs".

Specific types of schools including small schools and maintained nursery schools remain under extreme financial pressure and many are facing the real risk of closure. This is a huge concern and affects all parents!



How can Your School Lottery help schools raise money?

We're extremely passionate and equally proud of the huge impact of such a simple yet effective tool for raising funds and supporting the school community. As parents of school aged children, we're dedicated and committed and understand both the problem and the solution.

A school lottery might not be your only source for generating income. Playing to win - the battle for adequate funding

Schools that sell 50 tickets a week, raise over £1,000 a year, and their supporters have a chance to win the £25,000 Jackpot, a bonus prize in our monthly Super Draw, as well as a guaranteed cash prize for someone in the school, every week!

In 2024, many schools raised between £5k - £9k

A major blow to schools, but more importantly, to pupils, was the impact of budget cuts on critical resources such as instruments and music tutoring and the provision of basic life skills such as swimming lessons. Children of all abilities and backgrounds should be granted free and easy access to developing essential life skills. Only then will we see communities thrive!

A community that unites is a community that thrives

Your School Lottery is all about community fundraising. Schools and students benefit directly from money raised but parents, family members and friends who are the primary supporters of the school's lottery, also benefit – both directly and indirectly.



Tickets to play the lottery cost just £1 per week.

The way we split the pound works as follows: 70% is allocated to your school community, in the form of 40% directly as funds, and 30% as a cash prize to a supporter, every week. The remaining 30% covers Jackpots, our running costs and VAT. Plus we provide additional Super Draw prizes every month.



With Your School Lottery, parents also win!

In 2024, some lovely supporters who won in their school's lottery, donated their winnings back to the school!


